WORKSHOP THEMES – A choice of two workshops from the below:

1. **D/deaf Cultural Awareness** - delivered by Jane Birkin, Derbyshire Constabulary PLOD Manager and PCSO Christina Stanford. This workshop will equip individuals with additional knowledge and tools in order to support young people from the D/deaf community
